Maidstone were still posing a threat and they scored at 70<sup>th</sup> minute when the Darts defence failed to stop the cross coming in and failed to close down the ball. This gave the home side a bit of belief and while they were happy to chase the game, we were happy to play on the break. Marco Duarte came on for Frazer Bent and his first bit of action saw him dent the post from a ferocious strike from within close range. The visitors held out for a deserved win and this is no more than their overall game warranted.
